Each year, the Porchwalk searches for new and interesting artisans and craftsmen to add to the show. Moravian Manor’s own Woodshop Team will have their hand-made items among the nine artisans lining the lawns along Moravian Avenue.

of Moravian Manor. There will also be a benefit auction in Steinman Hall. The auction features the varied and talented work of the artisans in the show. Each artisan donates a piece of work to the auction. Monies raised benefit the residents of Moravian Manor.

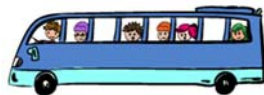
